The car campers and motorhomes along Binford was discussed. Perhaps a class action lawsuit against the homeless union, which may not be a union at all? We must figure out how to remove those people, get them the care that they need and housing. USF&WS service was out, but they have only one officer to service all of northern California to the Oregon border. Frank mentioned how quickly they acted in 2006 when it was clear that Gualala 4th of July fireworks disturbed protected nesting bird species on offshore monuments (rocks). January 11, 2023

Melanie had some good news about her 9-year legal nightmare coming to an end. It started with Sen. Dick Durbin setting the IRS after her pro-troop group Moving America Forward. They occupied her office in Sacramento but found they had done nothing wrong. In fact they believed it was the best run committee they're ever looked into.

George Soros then got Pro Publica to do a hit-piece on MAF using utter fabrications. No matter, it was good enough for Kamala Harris to launch a CA DOJ investigation into MAF and its officers. It was unfair to Melanie Morgan and MAF. The CA DOJ couldn't find a valid reason to press charges or indict. Statutes(?) have expired and they now want to settle. Instead of the \$2 million fine that wanted initially, it will be a small fine to settle. And the only MAF officers asked to resign was ready to do so anyway because of age.

Next up, Janine Pera! As usual, she is a font of new and relevant data related to COVID deaths and adverse vax reactions. She had new data on the 22-y-o that was involved in a traffic accident at 1:15 pm. He was found unconscious, unresponsive and in full cardiac arrest. If Janine mentioned his vax status, I didn't hear what she said. Sorry! But she is in contact with Sheriff Jamie Scardina, who has been very approachable.

She has also developed a good relationship with Coroner Roger Fielding and his staff. They were very receptive to the procedures she gave them regarding the proper way to determine if the deceased died of an adverse vax reaction, information she obtained from pathologist Dr. Ryan Cole and Steve Kirsch. The 22-y-o that died of a suspected vax-induced heart attack had an external examination only (with some blood draws?). Apparently, there is a way to determine if the heart attack was due to the vax.

An 11-y-o named Logan (who has a twin brother) died of acute cardio pulmonary arrest not due to natural causes.

The Marin County Coroner's office reports there is a 20% to 25% increase in caseload in what coroners must investigate. They don't currently have the staff or resources to meet the challenge, so it takes longer for them to complete their investigations. Marin County chief pathologist Joe Cohen has been very approachable and helpful to Janine.

A discussion of Cincinnati Bengal Damar Hamlin's cardiac arrest ensued. Todd Christopher described the chest protection worn by football players and how unusual it is for football players to succumb to commotio cordis resulting in ventricular fibrillation. The timing for that type of injury has a very small window, one on the order of 1/15,000th of a second. Plus, such victims normally drop immediately, no stagger back then fall.

January 11, 2023

Janine noted that, yes, all the players were deeply concerned for their fellow athlete, but judging by the looks on their faces, she thinks they were worried that it could happen to them. They aren't allowed to speak out on their concerns for adverse vax effects.

There were some questions about the recent suicide of a police sergeant in Tiburon. Did anyone know him? It is believed that Heather, who wasn't in attendance tonight, knew him. Something seems very suspicious about his death.

That's it for me tonight. I may not have captured all the comments – the food was too just too good to interrupt my meal.
