

Dear Fellow Baconators,

We were a small but terrifyingly vocal group this evening. We covered lots of ground under the strict speaking limits of moderator Morgan. Well, not so strict, everyone had a chance to speak.

Topics covered included the CA GOP convention the past weekend, women's gun lesson signups, MRWF March speaker, TPUSA, NRWF April speaker, pajama-wearing walking marijuana billboards, the evils of SPAHR, Binford Road, the imposition of state regulations on local housing, anti-child anti-parental choice legislation and PERK, and adverse vax reactions. Oh, and exorbitant "reparations" for black folks in SF. Phew!

Walter Jensen kicked things off with a summary of what happened at the CA GOP spring convention in Sacramento March 10-12<sup>th</sup>. As a first-time delegate he found it fun, exciting and wants to continue. Tief Gibbs, Tina Menard and I concurred! (Mia Camera and John Turnacliff were also first-time delegates.) It was disappointing in many aspects, especially the extreme effort to prevent Yvette Corkrean from becoming Regional Vice Chair of the Bay Area.

Yvette was up for a vote 9:00 am Saturday morning. Over 100 delegates showed up to vote, about 30 more than they anticipated (mostly MAGA). Photo ID and Delegate badges were needed to vote on paper ballots. Before the vote, one delegate from Alameda County noted that someone unbeknownst to him appointed to of his delegates. The new Chair of the Alameda GOP said that 5 of his delegate appointments were stolen by the previous Chair he defeated in January.

Shawn Steele of the RNC, the temporary Chair of the meeting, claimed he was powerless to do anything about it. The crowd objected vociferously. He conducted a voice vote to determine whether to proceed with a vote. Too close to call, so they agreed to eliminate 2 of the 7 dubious delegates from LA. (They should never have been allowed to vote in the Bay Area region in the first place!) Another voice vote to proceed with the vote occurred, and again it was too close to call. They then agreed to defer the issue to the Rules Committee at 4:00 pm later that day if the vote was within 5 votes. A standup vote to proceed was called, even though 30 people in back were already standing because there weren't enough chairs. The vote passed by a margin of 61-57 in favor of Jason Clarke, the current Vice Chair. (It is important to note that Jason Clarke was instrumental in the effort to steal delegates from David Chan.) Since the margin was less than 5 votes, the matter would be referred to the Rules Committee at 4:00 pm. (What they should have done was specifically state there was evidence of improper delegate appointments that the Rules Committee had to address, but they didn't.) Not to be outdone, Bryan Watkins, COO of the CA GOP, declared Jason Clarke the winner of that vote before the Rules Committee met.

At the Rules Committee, David Chan stated the specific CA GOP Bylaw that was broken, which was that the elected Chair appoints the delegates for his term and that the CA GOP improperly approved the appointments from previous Chair Bussell.

The Rules Committee acted quickly to claim they were powerless to address the issue and began to point fingers. 1) It wasn't on their agenda<sup>1</sup> and 2) It's a matter for the Proxies & Delegates Committee meeting later at 5:00 pm. They refused to act. What they should have done was to acknowledge that a Bylaw was broken, state their staff made a mistake, and defer the issue to the Proxies & Delegates Committee. But they didn't.

Are your eyes rolling yet?

The Proxies & Delegates Committee met at 5:00 pm. David Chan again made his case that his delegates were stolen from him in violation of the CA GOP's own Bylaws. Numerous first-time Delegates noted that failure to correct the error discouraged the young from participating in future conventions. They too acted quickly to do nothing. 1) Legal counsel declared that the Bylaw only applies in presidential election years (which was ridiculous because central committee elections are in non-presidential election years only.) 2) Their Bylaws didn't have a provision that allows them to remove delegates. 3) It's a matter for the county committee to resolve (again, ridiculous because it was a CA GOP Bylaw and a CA GOP staff error). What they could have done was accept 5 delegates from David Chan, delegates that would then go on to give Yvette Corkrean a 1-vote win.

On the bright side, a Tea Party candidate won the Regional Vice Chair for the Central Coast Region. He was nominated from the floor Saturday morning and took the establishment by surprise. They desperately messaged their colleagues to show up and vote, but it was too late.

Walter went on to describe one other egregious action on Sunday during the general session in which CA GOP officers would be elected to two-year terms. Voting that day was by electronic handheld device. There were 1382 Delegates and Proxies. (Delegates vote in person and on behalf of other delegates not in attendance that give them their right to vote.) There were many motions and resolutions to get through first. Two minutes were allowed for each vote, and the results appeared within 10 seconds or so. Despite impassioned appeals from LA Hispanic delegates, the motion to make Log Cabin Republicans permanent associates passed overwhelmingly. So good to mimic Democrat group rights instead of conservative individual rights! They also rejected Bylaw amendments that would proscribe selling proxies and to clarify that Chairs name delegates for their term in office only (not the next term).

The Chair was the first officer up for a vote, and the existing Chair won with 67% of the vote among 4 candidates. There were 3 candidates for Vice Chair with newcomer David Dhillon being a serious contender. One needed 50% of the vote plus 1 for a straight up victory else it

<sup>1</sup> Numerous attendees demanded that they put the item on the agenda, including a candidate for CA GOP Treasurer, Joe Grcar, Ex-Officio Member of the Alameda GOP. He was instrumental in getting David and other newcomers elected to oust most of the establishment officers. He blurted out "put in on the f\*cking agenda!" The Chair of the Rules Committee had him ousted from the meeting. COO Bryan Watkins had him ousted from the convention. BTW, Joe was responsible for getting Walter, Mia and Tief appointed as Delegates.

would go to a runoff with the bottom vote getter dropping out. Several long minutes passed after the first vote. Then, lo and behold! The incumbent won with 51% of the vote. Questions were asked about the denominator used to compute the win but went unanswered. (Present or present and voting?)

MAGA candidates for Secretary and Treasurer were also defeated. The establishment was able to successfully block MAGA and Tea Party candidates for Regional Vice Chairs, Chair of Chairs (John Dennis of SF GOP won that seat) this time around, but it will be more difficult for them in two years. Why? In the past, roughly one-third of the votes were delegates while the remaining two-thirds were proxies. For this convention, approximately two-thirds were delegates and only one-third proxies. The difference was that MAGA and Tea Party delegates showed up, and they aren't going away. They're expected to continue taking over central committees around the state and will have greater influence and power in 2025.

One other encouraging thing to note. We on the Marin Election Integrity Committee met a youth pastor named David Shoben(sp?) of the New Life Church in Novato. He mentors 85 high schoolers that came to him on their own without prompting from their parents, many of whom are areligious. After years of COVID, they're hurting and depressed and reaching out for spiritual guidance. They're also extremely interested in politics and current events. David helps them to think for themselves. Our group of six delegates met a similar young black man from Rocklin that was also a youth pastor. His story was the same except that he had over 200 kids. He too noted that a religious movement is building among youth. Couple that with the anecdotal experience of Patty Marty of TPUSA who says it's now "cool" for high schooler to be Catholics. Awesome!

Faye Bourret then spoke about signups for gun classes and the upcoming speaker from the Reagan Ranch at the MRWF meeting.

Tief mentioned that Charlie Kirk of TPUSA spoke at UC Davis despite threats from antifa, who protested his presence. One or two police officers were injured but it is unknown if any were arrested or charged. David Llamas of TPUSA spoke at the NRWF luncheon earlier that day. Unlike Patty Marty, he recruits college students in northern California. Some folks wanted to know how to contact his group on behalf of their kids or grandkids. Tief clarified that David prefers that kids approach him instead of having their parents or grandparents direct them. He's more successful recruiting kids that are motivated. He pointed out that there are numerous social media avenues for kids to contact TPUSA or to learn of their local events.

Tief turned to Instagram and read off a few TPUSA events in the Bay Area, including one with Riley Gaines at SF State April 6<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 pm. She also mentioned a Young Women Leadership convention in Dallas June. NRWF will sponsor multiple young ladies to attend that event.

She then went on to describe the difference between TPUSA school chapters and action hubs. School chapters require students, school administration approval, and frequently, a sponsor from the school. Action hubs are simply local groups that aren't associated with schools that meet largely for social events, such as Line Dancing at Sonoma State University.

Tief mentioned the NRWF speaker next month, an Apple Valley Pharmacist that is an expert on opioids and cannabis, both of which are extremely harmful drugs. (Curt Emmet ??).

Melanie told of the two pajama-wearing teens in line ahead of her at a coffee shop with ads for pot shops on the pajama tops. Given the psychosis and depression cannabis causes kids, this is an alarming state of events.

Ann McArthur spoke about Gov. Newsom's unaccountability of needle distribution of groups like SPAHN at the Marin City Park & Ride. They use state and federal money to facilitate drug use and LGBTQ sexuality. That in turn drives the homeless situation.

Melanie said they're now camping on private property along Grant Ave in Novato and the police do nothing. Ann mentioned that the City of Sausalito "resolved" their homeless encampment problem by giving each one \$20K to leave. The tennis courts they inhabited are still unusable because of human urine and excrement as well as damage caused by fires and explosions.

Someone mentioned Albert Park and a judge's restraining order preventing the City from removing its illegal inhabitants.

Mel then described how Toni Shroyer called off the protest at yesterday's Tuesday BOS meeting because she's getting cooperation from Sheriff Jamie Scardina, who has agreed to ticket and tow 60 abandoned vehicles. Nothing is yet planned for those living in RV's parked there illegally, but Toni continues to speak with Supervisor Lucan and Sheriff Scardina. We need to continue keeping up the pressure on them in other ways.

Clayton Smith then began to speak about state-imposed housing mandates that lead to high rises without adequate parking and other planning tragedies. There is a manufactured housing crisis in California. He offered as an example the tiny, clustered homes visible as one leaves Petaluma to the south will all those open acres beyond. California was once a dream where one could live how and where they wanted. Now we have undesirable programmed housing thanks to freaks like Scott Weiner from San Francisco. He's the architect of SB375 that allows greedy developers to bypass local standards and planning agencies. They can now build without conforming to hard won community standards.

It's difficult to maneuver around those state-imposed policies. Failure show progress on your 8-year plan halfway through allows the state to step in and take over. All of it is under the guise of

“affordability.” Lawsuits to fight these policies are underfunded. Trade organizations like the Department of Real Estate support it (as do construction unions).

Allocations and site selection are becoming beyond the purview of cities and towns. This is a political issue that can only be stopped by finding and electing new state Assembly Members. We must create the fear of God in families and homeowners who will see home values drop precipitously.

Tief – The state has refused to address the affordability issue and prefers to flood the market with new homes instead. Home prices will tank and substantial wealth will be lost!

There is significant opposition in deep blue Mill Valley, but Marin County Supervisor Katie Rice thumbs her nose at them. It was noted that Mary Grove attended two “meet and greets” with new Assemblyperson Damon Connolly, and both were dominated by Democrats angry about SB375. Tief pointed out that Connolly and Weiner have colluded to make adult smoking illegal, proposed anti-child anti-parent legislation in support of transitioning children as well as the unnecessary HPV vaccine mandate for school kids.

Tief encouraged folks to get on PERK or redpill.org for one-click opposition to these undesirable legislation efforts.

Melanie on Reparations! Wheeee! \$5,000,000 per black individual plus \$180,000 per year plus all debt wiped out. Walt thinks that the true intent is to break city and state government to ease the transition to socialism. Those bastards!

Ann said it’s about dividing people. Clayton said the new catchphrase on the SF BOS is “racial counting” as applied to racial health for racial equity in medical services.

Janine Pera then updated us on pending issues with her. She first pointed out that she received a lot of support from Clayton Smith. He’s active in COVID vaccines as well as housing and a variety of other issues.

Janine is waiting for the annual coroner’s report, which is expected in March or April. She’s waiting for their next report to the BOS, and she hopes they raise the issue that their case load has increased 20% to 25% so they can get more funding. She noted that the #1 cause of death in Alberta Canada is now “unknown cause of death.” (She has her suspicions on the cause.) The evil geniuses are still pushing vaccine boosters for children and infants. Now we have Dr. Redfield’s testimony regarding the origins of the virus – a lab escape! She missed going to Sacramento with Jeffrey due to the weather to work with the “Freedom Angels” but hopes to receive their training. Will the coroner’s report the increase in all-cause deaths? Wait and see.

Melanie wants to know if Marin County will update the accuracy of their Dashboard. She relayed the story of how sick her husband was a few weeks ago and the poor quality of care he received. 14 hours before he was admitted, then another 30 hours without food or water in a

lockdown ward. Locked to bed as a “high risk” patient because he once fell, or they thought he fell. He has the symptoms of PTSD because of that horrible experience!

Janine is seeking two to three individuals to come to BOS meetings with her to speak of their knowledge of adverse vaccine reactions. Susie Morlock mentioned two miscarriages of people she knew related to the mothers getting the vaccine or vaccine boosters. The babies died of heart attacks in the womb. Another friend now suffers from Guyon Barre Syndrome after taking her first vaccine booster. Others spoke of a teenaged girl that is now paralyzed after taking the shot and another that will be on pain medications for the rest of her life because of the shot.

Janine has been trying to get ahold of Dr. Ryan Cole to have him call the pathologists in the Logan case. She managed to get ahold of his assistant, who was kicked out of medical school for failing to take the vaccine. He assures her that Dr. Cole will reach out to the Marin County Coroner.

Janine mentioned that Marin County is the third highest vaxxed county in the country and we now have one of the highest late term miscarriage rates in the country. It’s not natural for babies to have heart attacks in the womb!
